Inclement Weather

This is a reminder to ensure that your child comes to school with appropriate clothing for being outdoors. As we know, the weather can change quickly, and we want to ensure students are prepared to be outside in colder temperatures. If your child needs a coat or mitts, please reach out to us as we have extra winter coats and accessories.

Snow Removal Around the School

Thank you to our custodiam Mr. Rampersaud for all his efforts in clearing the snow and ice from the school grounds. As temperatures are warming up we often get a freeze thaw cycle. Please use extra caution when walking there may be patches of ice.

Please note that the sidewalk area that runs in front of the school parallel to the road is cleared by the city. The wind rows are also maintained by the city.

Transportation

For families who use the yellow school bus a reminder to download the Bus Planner App for up-to-date information. The app will send notifications of delays or bus cancellations.

If your child rides the bus, it is important that you communicate with your child what arrangements are in place should the bus not arrive at their stop in the morning or if it is delayed, especially with colder temperatures.

We also ask that you ensure you have your contact information up to date in PowerSchool, so in the event the bus is delayed at the end of the day, the school can contact you to pick up your child.
